The means chosen to achieve these aims included inviting a remarkable guest speaker, Mr Paul Hockey, self-described 'one-armed bandit' who has successfully conquered the planet's highest mountain (Mt Everest), to be our guest speaker and then seeing if we could get the support of the town employers to celebrate the achievements of local people with disability and their own contribution to the community of Broken Hill. NOVA is fortunate to have a very committed and motivated team at Broken Hill – Jess, Brenda, Georgie & Linda worked very hard to find a great venue and organise an entertaining and inspirational night.

NOVA has been in Broken Hill for nearly 14 years and dozens of people have found work through the efforts of our staff. We chose to highlight the latest achievers from this group and particularly the success of the State government's Transition to Work program.

The evening was a great success.

As a direct result we have been offered 2 extra jobs and reminded the town's employers that while the mine might ebb and flow, the community spirit of Broken Hill's employers remains exceptional.

Where are they now?

After leaving school, I enrolled in TAFE to pursue a pathway course in horticulture. It soon became obvious that the physical difficulties I experience due to Cerebral Palsy meant that I was unable to continue. I switched courses and was offered an Australian Traineeship in General Office Support Services. Whilst studying I worked in the Business Services faculty at Richmond College.

After graduation, I approached NOVA Employment for assistance to find open employment in this field. With NOVA's support, I was successful in gaining employment as the Administration Assistant at a local disability service.

I loved this job and was very successful at it. NOVA continued to support me with travel training. I also managed to work for Australia Post, as a postal sorting officer during peak periods throughout the year. I remained with the disability service for ten years becoming the longest serving employee until the services' funds were cut and the position no longer existed.

Currently, I am seeking open employment with the help of NOVA. I hold a significant role as a volunteer secretary and communications member for the NSW Rural Fire Service in my local area and continue to study Information Technology at TAFE. I also participate in the community, welfare and pastoral care program at the local hospital. I love the people I meet and enjoy every moment of my work. My association with NOVA Employment continues because I have made friends and have been encouraged to continue job seeking in open employment of my choice.
